## **ACCESS TO CLINICAL APPOINTMENTS**

The surgery is open every weekday from 8.00am to 6,30pm and you may call the surgery to make routine appointments or for queries. We offer **face-to-face** appointments to all patients who wish to be seen by a clinician at the surgery. There are at least two GPs on duty everyday with appointments available in the morning and in the afternoon. We also have a Clinical Pharmacist for medication queries and a Physician Associate for minor ailments, available at the surgery.

# **TRAVEL VACCINES**

West End Surgery offers the full range of travel vaccines. Our Nurse is happy to give you relevant advice for the countries you wish to visit but please plan well ahead as we may need to order the vaccines.

#### **CHILDHOOD IMMUNISATIONS**

The incidence of measles & chicken pox is rising. If your child feels unwell and has developed a rash, please call the surgery before you bring the child to the surgery.

Parents are encouraged to ensure that their children are fully vaccinated against killer childhood diseases. An unvaccinated child is at risk of not only contracting the illness oneself but also passing it on to others and this is irresponsible on the part of the parents. Please make an appointment with our nurse, if you have any concerns.

### TREATMENT OF MINOR AILMENTS

Under the 'Pharmacy First' initiative, patients will also be able to access medicines for seven common conditions from their pharmacy without the need for a GP prescription from early next year. This service will cover the following **7 conditions**:

1. sinusitis 4. infected insect bites

sore throat
 earache
 impetigo
 shingles

7. uncomplicated UTIs in women

### **DIABETES**

Diabetes mellitus, often known simply as diabetes, is a group of common endocrine diseases characterized by sustained high blood sugar levels. Diabetes is due to either the pancreas not producing enough insulin, or the or the cells of the body becoming unresponsive to the hormone's effects.

The classic symptoms of untreated diabetes are frequency of passing urine, thirst, and weight loss. If you have any concerns, please make an appointment with our Health Care Assistant for a health check.

#### **CERVICAL SMEAR CLINIC**

Amanda Pritchard, Chief Executive of NHS England has indicated at a recent conference that cervical cancer will be eliminated in England by 2040, as a result of new strategies to increase the uptake of vaccines and screenings

Cervical cancer is found anywhere in the cervix and mainly affects women under the age of 45. Around 2,700 women are diagnosed with cervical cancer in England each year and around 850 die, according to Cancer Research UK. Eliminating cervical cancer will mean fewer than four in every 100,000 women in the population develop the disease.

While the vaccine is already being given in schools, new efforts will be made to increase numbers by giving the vaccine in libraries and sports centres, as well as chasing up women to attend their cervical screenings. This acceleration in vaccinating and screening will pave the path to the disease's eradication,

Eligible adult women due for cervical screening are invited to call the surgery to make an appointment with the nurse for this purpose. Those still in school, should take advantage of the HPV vaccine.
